In Bill Clinton's book, <u>GIVING</u>: <u>How Each of Us Can Change the World</u>, features stories of people making a difference including Bill Gates & Warren Buffet's philanthropic efforts. A six year old California girl organized a beach cleanup in her community showing us that folks of all ages can contribute.

The first part of the book addresses giving money, time, things and skills. In Chapter 7 we learn about gifts that keep on giving. Most of us know that Heifer International works to end world hunger by giving cows, goats and other food and income producing livestock and agricultural goods to poor families around the world. The bonus is that recipients of animals are required to share the first offspring with others in need, thus multiplying the impact of donated animals. Chapter 10, Organizing Markets for the Public Good, presents energy conservation as an opportunity for giving. Wal-Mart and Home Depot are two companies making an effort to persuade customers to go green as well as following energy saving practices themselves. Other chapters offer more examples of how we can give in a meaningful way.

Although <u>GIVING</u> was written in 2007 this book's message is still valid as it encourages readers to find their own ways to give through time, skills, money and/or ideas. It aims to inspire citizen activism and service as a powerful force for change. Happy Giving!!


TWO THINGS OF NOTE FOR THE PNNE PW RETREAT:
